

LACEY'S STORY OF HEALING

Ozone therapy and homeopathy have helped Lacey survive cancer – so far, for five years longer than her original prognosis.

A strong area of specialization in my practice is helping pets with cancer heal using nutrition and natural treatment modalities. Sadly, I have seen a dramatic increase in the number of cancer cases during the course of my career, and this keeps me motivated to look for new options in both treatment and prevention. I've been honored to experience the character and resilience of my patients, along with the diligence of their owners on many occasions. In this article, I am highlighting Lacey, one of my cases who has been both an inspirational healer and patient teacher.

Lacey was the first case in which I used ozone as a treatment modality; I'm grateful for the opportunity she provided to learn this valuable tool that supports the natural healing ability of the body. She's also a beautiful example of the benefits of a holistic healing approach using multiple modalities. Today, Lacey is a thriving 15 year-old. I believe you'll find her story both inspiring and educational.

Lacey first came to me as a ten year-old Border Collie mix with a recent cancer diagnosis. She'd recently undergone surgery to remove a growth from her right hind leg.

The biopsy had revealed an adenocarcinoma that was potentially aggressive, with a high likelihood it would regrow and spread to other parts of her body. The conventional options of chemotherapy and radiation were not appealing to Lacey's owner; she asked me if I would begin ozone therapy on Lacey instead.

A COMPELLING OPPORTUNITY

At this point in my career, ozone therapy was something that I had heard about, but had no formal training in how to use the equipment or choose treatment protocols for a cancer patient. I told Lacey's Mom that I needed to learn more before I would feel comfortable treating her. She replied that she'd already spoken to her own physician, who was using ozone to treat her human patients, and I was welcome to visit her clinic to learn more about the protocols they were using. In addition, if I agreed to treat Lacey, she was willing to buy the necessary equipment.

Well, I certainly couldn't refuse such a remarkable opportunity, and felt that I was clearly being guided to learn this modality. So I made an appointment with the clinic in Boulder, and headed up to learn more. After spending time learning about the equipment they used and watching the technician administer the ozone treatments, I was comfortable enough to begin using ozone therapy on Lacey.

THE OZONE THERAPY PROCESS

Ozone therapy is a way of oxygenating the body. It helps energize normal cells and boost the immune system. Most disease states thrive in low oxygen environments, so increasing the oxygen level can help eliminate cancer cells, along with



bacteria and viruses. There are a number of different ways to administer ozone therapy, and I chose several to use on Lacey to increase her chances of success.

First, there was a blood treatment. I drew blood from Lacey's leg, mixed it with the ozone gas, and re-injected it into her muscle. This provides a broad systemic effect of the ozone, reaching all areas of the body.

Next was rectal administration, where I delivered the ozone gas directly into her rectum. This is directly supportive of the intestinal tract and helps detoxify the liver.

Finally, I injected ozone directly under her surgical incision to help prevent regrowth of the mass. Lacey received ozone treatments twice weekly for a year.

At the end of that year, there was no sign of regrowth or spread of the cancer elsewhere in her body. Lacey was thriving! At this point we began to decrease the frequency of the ozone treatments – and she continued to do very well.

SUPPORT FROM HOMEOPATHY

Although ozone was a big part of Lacey's treatment protocol, there is never a magic bullet when it comes to treating cancer, and I always support the use of multiple treatment modalities. Nutrition is a very important foundation to good health, and Lacey was fed a raw diet along with immune building supplements.

She also received treatment from homeopathic veterinarian Dr Jan Facinelli (holisticcareforanimals.com). The treatment followed the homeopathic cancer protocol of leading Indian homeopath Dr Ramakrishnan. Lacey received the remedies Thuja 200C and Carcinosis 200C, alternating weekly. Dr Facinelli also prescribed a cancer supplement, RX Vitamins Onco Support. Lacey now receives the remedies every other month for maintenance.

Today, Lacey is five years past her cancer diagnosis, when conventional medicine gave her only six months to live.
